YEARS OF STRENGTH

Welcome to Canterbury College. The College Uniform is one that our students can be proud to wear. It is a symbol of belonging to our College community. Adherence to the Uniform and Grooming Policy is a visible means by which students indicate their acceptance of the values and principles of the College. It allows the student body to project an appropriate image to the wider community of what it means to be a member of the College. It is hoped that the positive reputation of the student body improves the opportunities that students gain when seeking to move into the wider community.

Uniform Standards

1. College formal hats are to be worn at all times when traveling to and from the College. They are to be worn square on the head and girls' hairstyles must not interfere with the appropriate wearing of the hat. On formal occasions boys and girls in Years P – 3 wear the blue formal hat, boys in Years 4 – 12 wear the grey felt hat and girls from Years 4 – 12 wear the white hat. During the school day students must wear a hat when they are outside the classroom. They may wear the formal hat, the blue sports cap or the legionnaire cap.
2. Students are to wear standard College black leather lace up shoes.
3. Boys' formal shirts with top buttons fastened, and all sports and formal shirts are to be tucked in at all times.
4. The wide end of boys' ties should be no lower than the belt.
5. Boys in Years 4 – 12 wear long socks up. Girls in Years 4 – 12 wear short socks that are folded down once.
6. Boys in Years P – 3 wear navy college shorts. Boys in Years 4 – 6 wear grey college shorts with black belt. Boys in Years 7 – 12 wear grey tailored college shorts with black belt.
7. All students in Years 7 – 12 must have a blazer with College badges on the left lapel.

8. All students in Years P – 6 must have a jumper (blazers are optional) and they are only compulsory on formal occasions. Blazers for Years P – 3 students are an optional item for boys only and they are to be worn with winter trousers. However, blazers for infant students are not recommended. On days when the weather is very cold, Years P – 3 students may choose to wear their full tracksuit over their winter uniform, including jumper, to gain extra warmth.
9. Optional items throughout the year:
 - Navy trousers for Years P – 3 boys
 - Grey trousers for Years 4 – 6 boys
 - Ribbed navy tights for Years P – 6 girls
 - Stockings for Years 7 – 12 except on formal occasions where they are compulsory (Colour: Slate)
 - Court shoes for Years 10 – 12 girls except on formal occasions when they are compulsory
 - Black school shoes for Years 10 – 12 girls
 - Senior Jersey – Year 12 students (may be worn as part of the uniform only within the College grounds)
 - Black or navy knitted gloves may be worn during winter
10. All students are expected to wear their sports shirt to PE lessons. Bicycle pants are not to be worn as part of the PE uniform, although they can be worn in certain sporting activities. Students in Years 1 – 3 may wear their PE uniform and sports hat to school on the days on which they have PE lessons. These students do not wear their formal hat on those days.
11. On cold days the students may wear their full school tracksuits over their PE uniforms.
12. Students in Years 4 – 12 who have PE in Period One and who travel straight to school by private vehicle may wear their PE uniform to school but they must change into their formal uniform straight after the PE class. Students traveling by public transport must wear their formal uniform and get changed into sports

uniform at school. Students who have a second PE lesson during the day (HPE students) may stay in their PE uniforms until the end of the second sporting class. All students who do not have PE classes in Period four are expected to attend regular classes in formal uniform regardless of their extra-curricular commitments. Students traveling home at 3.20pm either by private vehicle or public transport are expected to travel in their formal uniform. Students attending extra-curricular training and leaving the school after 4.30pm may wear their sports uniform home.

13. All students must have the light weight tracksuit. A student's name may be embroidered below the school crest on the tracksuit jacket and this must be done through the Uniform Shop. Only the tracksuit and not the College jumper may be worn over the PE uniform for extra warmth.
14. For sun safety, the legionnaires cap is compulsory for students in P – 3. Students in Years 4 – 12 have the choice of either the blue sports hat or the school cap for sports wear.
15. College bathers and swimming shorts are compulsory for students in Years 7 – 12. Swimming briefs for boys and the girls swimming bathers must be worn for interschool swimming meets. Years P – 6 girls must wear one piece bathers.
16. Interschool sporting teams may have team uniforms. All students competing in Interschool competition will wear the full tracksuit to and from the event.
17. Sports shoes are to be low cut lace up joggers and predominantly white in colour.
18. Students in P – 3 bring their gear to school in the College Infant backpack and tote bags. Students in Years 4 – 12 have a College sports bag for PE gear and they have the option of either the College trolley bag or backpack for books.

Jewellery and Grooming

19. No jewellery is to be worn to school, with the exception of one pair of plain gold or silver sleepers or stud (round in shape) earrings if necessary (girls only). Watches may have either a black, brown, gold or silver band. Brightly coloured bands must not be worn. Tooth jewellery is not permitted.
20. Students are not to wear body piercing such as eyebrow, nostril, lip and tongue piercings. Plastic studs for body piercings are not permitted.
21. Body tattoos are not permitted.
22. Boys are expected to be clean shaven at all times. Side burns may be no lower than the bottom of the ears.
23. Girls with hair longer than the bottom of their collar must have hair tied up. Hair ribbons may be navy, red or white. Hair bands may be black or brown.
24. Students may not attend school with dyed hair. This includes streaks and tips. If a student does attend school with dyed hair, parents will be contacted and the hair will need to be returned to natural colour as soon as possible.
25. Make up and nail enamel are not to be worn.
